What is CFO?

CFO is an Interdenominational lay movement to make Christianity real and vital. It is open to everyone.

People have an opportunity to learn to live with one another as Jesus Christ taught his first disciples and to experience the love of God and family.

In 1929, CFO came into being. It was the inspired dream of Dr. Glenn Clarke, a college professor, to provide places for people to meet several days at a time in order to come into balance spiritually, mentally, and physically.

This is done in a variety of ways...listening to speakers, creative activity, recreation, rhythmical expression and learning to pray.

Prayer is the main ingredient of a successful Christian life and prayer is kept central in the camp.

CFO is a place where the power of prayer is experienced and where God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit become real.

It is an opportunity to come apart for a while, in an atmosphere of loving fellowship where each camper catches a glimpse of the Kingdom and is thus enabled to return to their own church a more radiant witness to the glory of God.

Lodge: This is a 2 storey building. Campers may request first floor if stairs are a concern. Many rooms have a 2 piece bathroom and there are common showers and bathrooms for men and women on the first floor. No second floor showers.

Most rooms have 4 single beds. Some rooms have queen size beds. Pillows and blankets are provided. Sheets & towels are available on request for an additional fee of \$6.00 +HST

Rooms with washrooms - (Adults)

Double: \$26.00 / person /night + HST

Triple: \$15.50 / person /night + HST

Rooms without washrooms – (Adults)

Double: \$24.00 / person /night + HST

Meals as per Table 2.

Facility fees of \$2.50 + HST per person per day are extra.

Cabins: Sleep 8-10 people and are equipped with hydro. Washroom facilities are nearby. You must provide your own linens, towels and pillows. **Cabins are \$32/group/night + HST and Facility fees per person. Meals are extra. (Table 2)**

Camping: Campsites are available with hookups for water and hydro.

Sites are \$32 per day plus Facility fees.

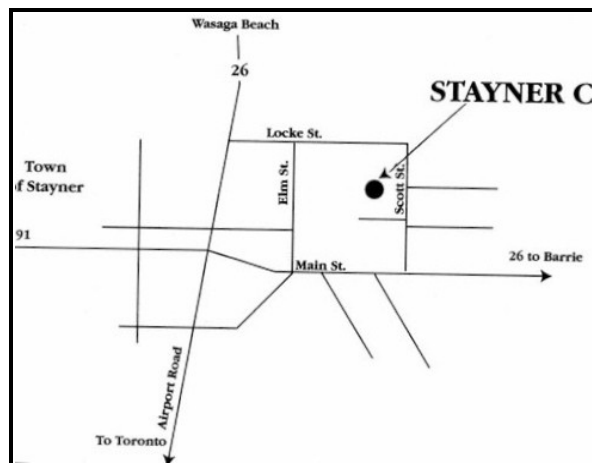
Campers may order meals in Lodge as per requested in advance.
